Tips for Building a Positive Relationship With Your Horse

- * Never think "predator-prey relationship"
- * Teach your horse to accept pressure
- * Always work with the horse to achieve mental and physical balance
- * Recognize the negative effects of over-flexing your horse
- * Stay calm to relax a nervous horse
- * Keep groundwork to a minimum
- * Use a little equipment as possible
- * Practice the emergency stop
- * Self-discipline is a virtue - remember that when you're with your horse.

OUR TOWN Lamont, Alberta

Established in 1905 - 1906, this town site on the CNR main line from Winnipeg to Edmonton was named for John Henderson Lamont (1865-1936) who was at that time the Attorney General of Saskatchewan, the first person to hold that post. A Toronto lawyer, Lamont moved to Prince Albert in 1899 and sat briefly in the House of Commons before joining Saskatchewan's first provincial cabinet. He later became a Supreme Court Judge. Lamont became a Village in 1910 and a Town in 1968.
